John Teeple then addressed the group concerning the upcoming Relay for Life. Event dates are June 9 & 10, 7 p.m. to 7 a.m. Fundraising begins now. Teeple and Stacy East are forming an Executive Relay for Life Committee. Please contact them if you are interested in serving. They have decided to form one big team, but each club/organization will conduct various activities within the team. Registration deadline is March 21. Cost is \$10 per person. The Relay for Life is an annual fundraising event sponsored by the American Cancer Society to find a cure for cancer and provide assistance to people in treatment. Danny Claborn commented that the concept of having one big team is a great idea and should allow for more coordination. Force reminded those present to submit Activity Requests and Points Verification Forms for individual club participation. Teeple and Force mentioned the desire to have ACA representatives back to the Roundtable as the event approaches.
